

As part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the U.S. Department of Energy is providing funding to states and territories to support consumer rebate programs for ENERGY STAR qualified appliances. Under these programs, consumers can receive rebates to purchase energy-efficient appliances when they replace used appliances. Eligibility guidelines, covered products, and rebate amounts differ by state, so consumers should review program requirements carefully.

REBATES AVAILABLE

Instant rebates for clothes washers, dishwashers, freezers, and refrigerators began April 22, 2010 and ended April 25, 2010. Mail-in rebates for heating, ventilation, and air conditioning equipment (HVAC) and water heaters are scheduled to begin June 1, 2010. Additional mail-in rebates for clothes washers, dishwashers, freezers, and refrigerators will also be available beginning June 1, 2010. The rebate program will end when funds run out. Split systems must have a heating seasonal performance factor of at least 8.2, a Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio (SEER) of at least 14.5, and an Energy Efficiency Ratio (EER) of at least 12. Single-package equipment must have a heating seasonal performance factor of at least 8, a SEER of at least 14, and an EER of at least 11.	\$300
	Ground-Source	ENERGY STAR qualified. Open loop systems must have a coefficient of performance of at least 3.6, and an Energy Efficiency Ratio (EER) of at least 16.2. Closed loop systems must have a coefficient of performance at least 3.3, and an EER of at least 14.1. Direct expansion (DX) systems must have a coefficient of performance of at least 3.5, and an EER of at least 15.	\$300

HOW TO APPLY

From April 22 to 25, 2010, participating retailers provided consumers with an application for an instant rebate for clothes washers, dishwashers, refrigerators, and freezers at the time of purchase.

Beginning June 1, 2010, consumers can obtain all necessary application forms for mail-in rebates for HVAC, water heaters, clothes washers, dishwashers, freezers, and refrigerators by visiting the program sponsor's Web site. Rebates will be issued to consumers after mailing an application packet including proof of purchase of an eligible product and address information. Rebates will be paid on a first-come, first-served basis.

ELIGIBILITY

Consumers must be North Carolina residents 18 years or older. Customers must be replacing an existing appliance. Consumers and retailers are required to recycle old appliances in accordance with state laws. Rebates will be limited to one appliance rebate per household, and two HVAC unit rebates per household.
